JUVENILE CORRECTIONAL INSTITUTION (JCI) PLACEMENTS

In 2010, the Division of Juvenile Corrections operated three JJCIs—Ethan Allen School and Lincoln Hills School for boys and Southern Oaks Girls School


In 2010, the Division of Juvenile Corrections:

- Provided community supervision to 560 youth and billed \$6.04 million for those services
- Provided community residential services for 234 youth and billed \$5.72 million for those services
- Spent \$339,142 on other support and supervision services, including intensive family-based supports, counseling, AODA treatment, and other services




County Juvenile Justice Services

County human service departments or county courts provide intake and dispositional services for youth referred to the juvenile justice system, including intake services, determining whether youth should be held in custody, providing counseling and other support services, and developing and monitoring supervision plans.



* DOES NOT include costs for short-term detention services or Juvenile Corrections costs (for JCI, Supervision, services, or Placement costs)

Total amount expended by counties on Juvenile Justice Services in 2010 was approximately \$217
